

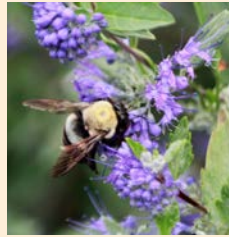
FALL-BLOOMING POLLINATOR-FRIENDLY PLANTS

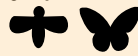

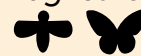

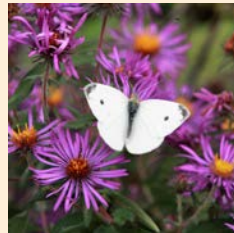
