PLAN AHEAD!

If you cannot ride the bus, chaperones must park in the main Vine Street parking lot. Parking is \$10, unless you have a Zoo membership.

Zoo membership can be used for parking only.

Do not attempt to retrieve any items that fall into an exhibit. Zoo staff will retrieve for you.

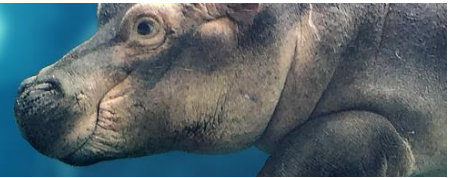
SAFETY & FIRST AID

We want everyone to have a fun, safe, and educational Zoo visit. For the safety of your students, other visitors, and the animals, please ensure that all students under your supervision follow the following field trip rules:

Respect the animals. Please do not yell or throw things at animals or bang on enclosures.

Do not feed the animals. Zoo animals are on special diets and other food can be harmful for them. Do not feed local wildlife around the zoo as this can lead to injured animals and people, alters the natural behavior of animals, and may lead them to being sick.

Please respect the rocks, rails & roots! Always stay on the walkways in the Zoo, behind barriers, off fences and rocks, and out of plant areas.

Seek assistance from any Zoo staff or volunteers if a member of your group becomes lost or if you need first aid or other emergency assistance.

Help keep the Zoo clean by placing litter in the proper trash/recycling receptacles.

Do not attempt to retrieve any items that fall into an exhibit. Zoo staff will retrieve for you.

Be respectful of other guests. Help us ensure that all guests have a safe and enjoyable day by refraining from running, shouting, pushing, or using offensive language.
