


3rd-5th Grade: Animal Defenses

Description: Animals inherit traits from their parents and ancestors that help them survive

Location at Zoo: Bird House, World of the Insect, Cat Canyon/Night Hunters, Reptile House Materials: Pencil

1. In the wild, animals are always on the hunt for their next meal. **Predators** hunt, stalk, and attack **prey** to provide them nutrients. Animals have adaptations that give them the ability to catch their meals. Let's review how the flow of energy works in a food chain. Below are several animals in an *ecosystem*. Create a *food chain* using arrows as the flow of energy. Draw and name at least four animals or plants in your ecosystem.



2. Although **predators** have some strong offensive, attacking skills, it doesn't mean **prey** waits around to be someone's dinner. All animals have special defense skills that protect them. These skills are called *adaptations* and have been passed down through generations. Look around at the different animals at the Cincinnati Zoo & Botanical Garden then, name and draw an animal that matches each defensive skill adaptation.
