4 Year Olds-Kindergarteners All in the Family

Keeping track of all the animals in the world is no easy task! In this camp, we'll explore the clues that help us classify reptiles, amphibians, birds, mammals, and insects into their families. But be ready—some animals don't follow the rules!

1st-2nd Grade Troops, Groups, and Herds

Who is in your "pack"? Is it just your family or are friends allowed, too? Do you eat together, play together, and take care of each other? Did you know some animals live, eat, and hang out in groups together, too? Bring your gaggle, flock, or pride to the Zoo and discover which animals stick together, how they form and maintain their bonds, and how group life helps them to survive.

3rd-4th Grade I Wonder...

Does looking at animals fill you with wonder? Does walking around the Zoo spark a million questions? During this camp we will be the scientists investigating what the Zoo animals are up to. With our inquiring minds and untamed eyes, we will explore animal behaviors through investigations of our own creation.

5th-6th Grade Dr. Zoolittle's Animal Training Camp

Discover how to "talk" to animals! Campers will be training new behaviors with some of our Zoo animal ambassadors. Learn about animal behavior and motivation while applying training techniques taught by Zoo professionals. By the end of camp, animals will be eating out of your hands, literally!

7th-8th Grade Mini-Maynard Training Camp

Join us for a week-long adventure and discover what it takes to become a future Zoo Director! Our Zoo Director, Thane Maynard, is known as a wildlife expert, a naturalist, author, and is a regular on T.V. shows promoting wildlife conservation. Campers will experience the many different jobs Thane has had on the way to becoming our Zoo Director. Campers will learn about animal handling, meet ambassador animals up-close, and create a "90-second naturalist" podcast of their own on their way to becoming the next Zoo Director. Watch out, Thane!

Join us as we meet these extreme animals and discover why they must act the way they do. Your camper will explore the animal and plant kingdoms by meeting our ambassadors face-toface! They will identify their features and decide who is the fastest, strongest, or largest of them all!

1st-2nd Grade Zoo Scene Investigators (ZSI)

Get your detective hats ready—you're on the case! Who left those paw prints behind while trespassing? Does a cheetah need a speeding ticket? A rat snake shakes his tail pretending to be a rattler...is that identity theft? Tackle "Who dun it's" around the Zoo as you learn how to study animal behavior and animal clues in this fun and immersive camp experience!

3rd-4th Grade Choose Your Own Adventure: Animal Rescue

We have an action-packed week planned for your camper. Campers will choose adventures that require teamwork to understand animal populations and what information should be collected to help rescue these animals. Every day, campers will rescue a different animal, make measurements, take weight, and estimate population sizes using field techniques. It's a real child-led adventure without leaving Cincinnati!

5th-6th Grade Animal Behavior 101

Studying an animal's behavior in the wild or in a zoo can help us get to know them better as individuals AND give scientists valuable insight into the nature and habits of their species. This knowledge can lead to improvements in their care and conservation. During this week-long camp, we'll utilize Zoo hikes and special animal visits to focus on learning the basics of animal observation and investigate the questions that come up.

7th-8th Grade Zoo Careers

Running a zoo involves a lot more than meets the eye. Join us for a week of exploring the many jobs involved in taking care of the Zoo's animals and creating a great experience for Zoo visitors. You'll get a chance to get down, dirty, and creative with hands-on activities, animal encounters, and Behind-The-Scenes tours. We'll also round out the experience with some guest speakers who will give you a better understanding of the variety of zoo careers that we have here at the Cincinnati Zoo & Botanical Garden.

Sleep with the Manatees

Florida is full of diverse habitats that are bursting with thousands of animal species, from walking-on-water basilisks to slow-andsteady manatees. We'll dive headfirst into the astonishing biodiversity of these southern habitats, centering around the lives of our resident manatees who are a part of our rehabilitation program with Florida conservation groups. We'll get behind-thescenes to see how we care for them, and then learn more about the amazing world we live in. When the night ends, you'll doze off at our Manatee Springs building with manatees floating by your bed.

Twiga Tented Safari

Only available April–October. A truly one-of-a-kind experience, our Twiga Tented Safari will take you across the African grasslands. We'll traverse through Africa, listening to tales of innovation for living harmoniously with wildlife, such as how a flashlight can shield you against lions, or why a puppy raised with goats can save cheetahs. On our safari, we will get behind-the-scenes at Hippo Cove and uncover secrets of our world-famous bloat. We'll finish up our night at our twiga tents, gathered round a roaring campfire roasting s'mores. Then, this unique adventure ends with a relaxing night in our shared safari tents on cozy cots and waking up to breakfast overlooking Giraffe Ridge.




