SUMMER CAMP 2025 Animal Behavior 101

Day One: Inquiry

Today, we will learn about the importance of Inquiry and the QUEST model.

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Day Two: Observation

Today, we will learn about Observation and the difference between Innate and Learned Behaviors.

Today, campers will learn about methods of animal training, like operant conditioning, and that human behavior can be studied in the same way as non-human animal behavior.
